I need some information to help me update the calendar.

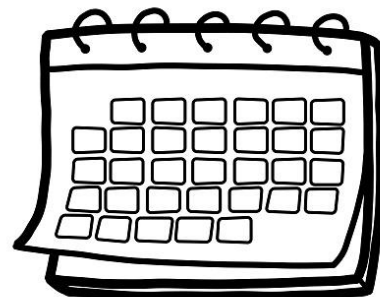
First, if you are head of a working team, please provide me with a list of everyone on your team. Emailing minutes etc. is easier if I know who needs to see it.

We finished a house for Guadalupe, Pedro and Jose through 1Mission, and we could not have done this without your financial support, your prayer, and your encouragement. We worked hard, but at the end of our two and a half days, Guadalupe and her boys now have a safe place of their own, and our hearts are full of love for them.

We were even able to rescue a dog (now named Julie) who seemed like a stray, and kept hanging around our build site. She had a huge open wound on the side of her neck. On our 3rd and last day, she was caught and transported to a dog rescue place that took her in, provided surgery, and will keep her through her healing. One of the women on our team, who is from Prescott, AZ, told them she would like to adopt Julie, once her medical condition is stable. This made us all very happy.

Bob will be putting together a video of our trip that we will show in church, and on our website so we can better share our trip with you.

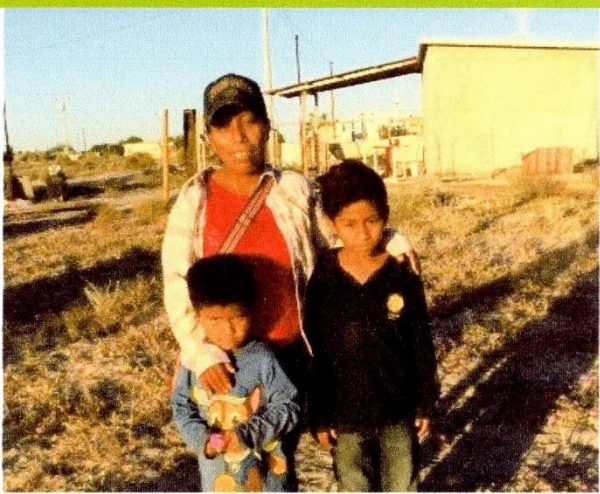

About Guadalupe and her Boys

Originally from the state of Guerrero, Guadalupe has lived in Puerto Penasco for the past 10 years. This is where she met the father of her two children, eight-year-old Pedro Ivan and four-year-old Jose Arturo. They were together for six years, but they have been separated for the past three years and she is now raising her sons on her own with little help from their father.

Guadalupe works as a beach vendor, and has to pay for her childcare while she works. She makes enough to provide for their basic needs, pay her rent, and make payments on her land lot, but she is completely without the resources to do any construction of a home on her own.

A house from 1MISSION would not only free Guadalupe from her rent payment, it would provide her with the security of home ownership, the knowledge that she will always have a safe and secure home for her and her sons.

Good Financial News:

Due to many generous gifts and increases in giving during January, we have erased the red ink from our balance sheet. This giving included a one-time anonymous gift of \$20,000, for which we are all grateful. We pray that this generosity will continue throughout the year; our staff have been paid, and all bills are current. The General Fund balance is now \$8,406; the Canopy Fund balance is \$43,961. Your Leadership Team and Stewardship work group will continue to encourage us in our giving to the ministry of this church as we 'Worship God, Follow Jesus, Love and Serve All'.

WLUMC ENDOWMENT MONTHLY REPORT

As of 1/31/2023 the Fund's value stands at: \$150,588.99.

The breakdown for the month's action is:

The Fund gained \$9,035.75 during January.

Wow, what a dramatic change to the start of 2023 from the previous year. Last year was a rough year for our Fund. We lost money in 9 of the 12 months, and yet when it came to choosing to make a grant for this year, the team chose to award the maximum amount allowable by our by-laws, 5.5% of The Funds December 31, 2022, amount or \$8,180.00*. This year's grant went to The WLUMC General Fund to help alleviate a cash flow problem in the amount needed to pay our bills (\$25,000.00/ month) versus monthly giving income (\$22,000.00/month).

We were able to do this according to The Fund's by-laws that state that the Leadership Team can request a Special Charge Conference to request monies from The Fund when it is deemed, we are in dire financial need. That Charge Conference was held on Monday, January 23, 2023, and the request passed.

What a wonderful gift we have in The Endowment Fund. We have now given out \$150,900.00 worth of grants since 1999. Simply amazing. We have aided many a program within the church as well as some in the community. It's been and continues to be a blessing. I think of it as "THE GIFT THAT NEVER STOPS GIVING".

As we journey through 2023, let us always remember that God has been good to us. I believe we may be in for some more tough times this year as in 2022, but hopefully not as many or as harsh. Our economy still has not found its footing from the COVID-19 epidemic years. I am confident, that regardless this year's trials, we will be alright, and The Fund will continue to provide for those programs that need a little extra financial help.

Your continued prayers are always welcome for our church, its people, and this Fund. They do work. This Fund is a testament to that fact.

*Difference in amount awarded \$8,180.00 and amount disbursed \$7,180.00 is \$1,000.00. The disbursement only shows what was taken from The Fund (\$7,180.00). The \$1,000.00 was returned to our checking account as is specified in our by-laws by an awardee that did not use it and with that, we wrote a check for the total amount (\$8,810.00) to the General Fund.

Trustees Update

Good day to All: Lots going on with our buildings.

Praise Center:

- We see no issues with our roof over the sanctuary. We will continue to monitor with our roofing folks to make the necessary changes to prevent leaking. We will get that mess fixed in the sanctuary as soon as we are confident that pesky leak is stopped.
- Extinguishers are now up to date. Replacements for outdated units as well as units needing recharge are done. We will put new units in place after recharging and or replacement. Only two units were affected by the recharge and or out of date issues. Stove fire protection system was inspected and tested as well. All Good.
- We are reviewing the Praise Center for Solar Systems installation. As for our Montague Campus, we look at our roof and supporting structure as well as the economic return from completing the project.
- Thank you all for your continued efforts to support this building and the incredible ministry it supports.

Montague Campus:

We have a wonderful start to the funding for the Canopy Project. Just a note; however, we will not be moving ahead with any more significant canopy spending until we see an improved financial status for our church.

- We have completed our work to improve the power to our sound booth in the sanctuary. Thanks to Jack Grenell, John Lloyd, and Bob Tuttle in completing this part of the Canopy Project. This is the reason for our ceiling being partially removed in the Welcome Center. We will review the replacement of that part of our ceiling as we get closer to our goals in church finances and canopy project funding.
- The Tech Team is working hard to improve our streaming, live service, and radio presentations. Pastor Tim brings a whole new set of opportunities for our systems. We enjoy the challenges they pose for our systems and our resolve to improve them. Again, this team of Bob Suits, Bob Tuttle, Fred Nichols, Grant Belinger, Alex Hayden as well as booth operators, Corina Mitteer and now Clay Cudney making our presentations happen each week.
- A huge thanks to John Lloyd, Jim Tanis, Ken Wentworth, Bob Tuttle with another part of our Canopy Project. The sound absorbing materials have been applied to three of the four walls in our Fellowship Hall. Both these projects we completed with minimal costs thanks to our congregational expertise in these areas. What an incredible group to work with. We will be putting the History Quilt up on the west wall of the fellowship hall. We will recenter the quilt on the wall as the coffee station was not on that wall when we removed the quilt for repairs and cleaning. We may add more sound deadening material to the west wall as the quilt being centered will make room for more sound deadening material.
- I will be proposing a Solar Project for both the parsonage and Montague Campus. It, at the initial review, seems like a great opportunity to save money and help the environment. I am gathering more information on this and will be making a proposal to the Leadership Team at our next meeting for adding roof mounted solar panels to both the parsonage and Montague Campus buildings. Roof condition is being reviewed as I write this. We will need to make our roofs up to date before we can add panels to them. More to come.

- We will continue with our infrastructure improvements. As you may recall we replaced our 55-year-old electrical transformer last summer. We had a major electrical failure underground. At the point of fixing the problem we and the power company decided to replace the line coming to the church as well as the old transformer. That was accomplished at no cost to our congregation. I finally have a valid response for our Gas Company. Our old 1968 meter is finally going to be replaced. I have been after the gas company for quite a while to replace the unit which sits inside our building in the boiler room. That is now NOT CODE. So, this spring, or as soon as the thaw occurs, we will replace the entire line from the street with a new meter on the outside of our building. It will be placed away from, west, of the memorial garden.

Parsonage:

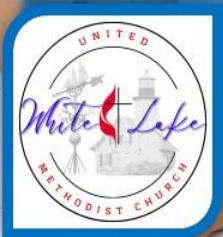
