On Saturday, March 22nd, 5 members of our UWF joined others at the Western Waters District Spring Fling. After registration, we gathered in the Hart UMC sanctuary to share worship. Rita Caviness, Director of Hope Project in Muskegon then shared with us about her work helping and working with clients who have experienced human trafficking firsthand. She shared their stories, and the sense of purpose she experiences in her work as an expression of her spiritual journey.

Next, we had a choice of three breakout sessions. 1) UWF online tutorial 2) UWF Reading Program, and 3) making greetings cards for Easter. Then shared a tasty lunch in the Fellowship Hall.

At our final session, we heard from Lauren Mein, a legal assistant for Farmworker Legal Services. Lauren shared the stories of farm workers who FLS supports, and the many legal issues they must navigate. Michigan has a massive dependency on migrants, local, out of state, and from other countries, to gather the many crops we grow here. At FLS they have a team of just 9 people to cover the entire State of Michigan! The whole day was very informative.

As the fund begins its yearly time of issuing grants, the fund showed a gain since February 2024. The Endowment team has voted to provide \$5,723 from the fund for grants this year. The total amount designated to be awarded in grants for 2025 is \$10,971 or 5.5% of our February 1st balance of 2025, which was \$204,914.92. The \$10,971 was divided into 3 categories with each getting a percentage based on the fund’s bylaws. Trustees were awarded 44% or \$4,827, Special Projects 33% or \$3,420, and Special Missions 23% or \$2,524.

After allowing groups and teams to apply for grants for a month, the Endowment Team met on Monday, March 3rd to finalize the awards. This year 14 applications were made, not counting Trustees, with 13 awards being made.

This marks the 27th year that grants have been issued from the fund over \$172,000 have been awarded to so many different groups/projects/missions for their efforts. We have a wonderful legacy those first and continuing contributors along with those forefathers/mothers who dreamed this dream and made it happen had and continue to have on this church.

The finance report for February shows that the general fund giving was adequate to cover expenses with a \$3,159 surplus. Giving for the year so far has met expenses with a surplus, although January tends to be a strong giving month.

Our general fund checkbook balance as of the end of February was \$23,740 which is less than enough to cover 1 month's expenses.

The church is up-to-date on its Ministry Shares obligations.
