Here's the recipe for one of our favorite desserts (thanks Melita!). Do you have a recipe you'd like to share? If you missed this event, fear not! We will be having another Townhall/Potluck event in a few months. Watch this space for a date soon.

### **Chocolate Eclair Dessert – by Melita Swier**

1 box graham crackers

2 small packages vanilla instant pudding

3 c. milk

16 oz. Cool Whip

1 tub chocolate frosting

Break graham crackers into squares and place close together in bottom of 9x13 pan.

Combine pudding, milk, and Cool Whip in a large bowl.

Spread half of the mixture over the crackers.

Put another layer of graham crackers over the pudding mixture.

Pour and spread the remainder of the pudding mixture over the crackers.

Top with a final layer of crackers. (If serving a crowd, break the crackers into the smallest rectangles and arrange them evenly. This makes it easier to cut the dessert when ready to serve.)

Empty the chocolate frosting into a microwave-safe bowl and heat just until it is easy to manage. Spread the frosting carefully over the dessert.

**Important:** Refrigerate undisturbed for at least 10 hours.

\*If you split the crackers and pudding into 3 or 4 layers, it is even better!

### **HELPFUL INFORMATION – from Ruth Fekken**

When the federal government declared a Public Health Emergency during COVID-19, States had to stop reviewing the eligibility of existing Medicaid beneficiaries for disenrollment purposes on an annual basis. This has allowed 355,000 residents to be enrolled in traditional Medicaid, and 367,000 in Health Michigan plan enrollees. The state is going back to pre-pandemic annual review which could result in people being removed. Many people will remain eligible but need to verify eligibility and possibly re-enroll.

# WLUMC ENDOWMENT MONTHLY REPORT

As of 3/31/2023 the Fund's value stands at: \$149,544.17.

The Fund gained \$3,024.01 during March.
