From the Pastor's heart...

When I was a teenager (many moons ago!), I had my doubts about "The Church". I had grown up in my parents local United Methodist Church all my life, attended Sunday School, sang in the cherub and children's choir, attended the youth fellowship for a time, and generally been in the company of folks who were Christians... and yet I had my doubts. The world that I saw was filled with hypocrisy, racial intolerance and bigotry, social and economic injustice. Closer to my home in the village of Vicksburg, Michigan in the southwest area of our state in the 1970's, we were deeply affected by conflicts between local government officials and all the mudslinging that comes with it, rising gasoline and utility prices with the oil embargo, a sagging automotive industry, the accompanying rise in unemployment, and local young men and women in our armed forces in harm's way throughout the world (sound familiar?) And yet amidst all this chaos and my own personal doubts about what the Church was, is and is supposed to be, as well as my place in the scheme of things, God led me to these faith-filled words from the Old Testament:

Deuteronomy 6:4-6 (NIV) Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts.

Now this made sense to me! God is God. One God who deserves all our love, praise and worship. One God who unites us one with Him and one with each other. One God whose message is for everyone . . . yes, I said everyone. Male or female. Rich or poor. Old or young. Whatever our ethnic background. Whatever our political affiliation. Whatever our economic or social status. The Lord our God, the Lord is ONE.

One God who can unite all the world . . . all his children in an eternal common purpose. One God who can lead us from doubt to faith. One God in whom we can find the security and safety that we all need and want for those we love. One God who loves us so much that the keys to his kingdom are within our grasp; The very criteria that can solve all the world's problems, doubts, struggles, and injustices if we all will simply agree to these two commandments:

Matthew 22:36b-40 (NIV) “‘Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’ All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.”

The closer we come to being one with God the closer we can become to being one with God and each other.

Still have your doubts? Join the club. Still looking for something perfect and untarnished to spiritually cling to in this desperate world? Join the club. Still trying to find a place where folks are trying, or at least making an honest attempt, to live in love with God and each other? Join a church...join White Lake United Methodist Church and our many and varied opportunities to share the Love of Christ! Already a member? Get involved! Will you find it perfect – no. Will you find it still suffering from the sin and chaos of the world – yes. Ah, but you can find hope by joining with a group of others on the journey, the quest, for the unity from which all diversity comes – God. If you look hard enough, with the love of God in your hearts, I believe that you will find that the answers you have sought have been right in front of you the whole time. Join me on this journey of love, mercy, and forgiveness.

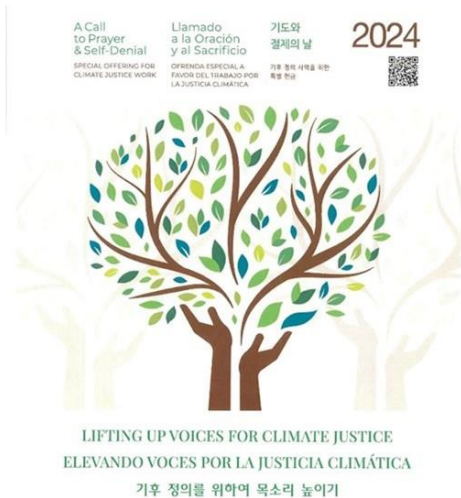

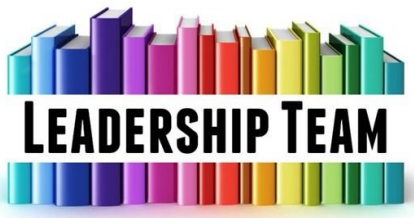

2024 FIRST QUARTER UPDATE

Your leadership team wants to keep our congregation informed, so here is a summary of my presentation at April's Town Hall meeting.

We are an active and engaged congregation, providing many opportunities for spiritual growth for those within our church family and service to those beyond it. While we offer many programs, the most extensive and successful are at the Whitehall campus; the Free Store and The Gathering, our free meal offering. They are now each their own 501C3 non-profits, independent from the church, as was always the plan. This independence from the church broadens what grants are available for their support. Currently, we house them and largely support and administer them. We are achieving an ever-increasing profile in the communities we serve, largely because of these programs.

Your church leadership views The Praise Center as our Mission Site. This is a very Methodist thing to do, as historically Methodism has always addressed social issues through community outreach and service, fulfilling human needs, and offering worship and fellowship.

Our goal, our calling, both as part of the Great Commission and as the vision statement of the UMC, is to make disciples. We are accomplishing that. The eight new members who joined us on Easter Sunday are a testament to this as some of these members started out as recipients of our outreach and are now serving the needs of others. We are growing the Church in both senses!

Historically and statistically, it takes 100 - 120 attending members to support a full-time ordained pastor and the programs, ministries, and physical plant of a church. We have recently seen an increase in attendance at both services. Comparing the first quarter of this year to last year's first quarter, we are averaging 12 more participants in Sunday worship; a 13% increase. Comparing the three weeks after Easter year-to-year, we are experiencing a 21% increase over 2023 with 119 people in worship each Sunday. We are exceptional, in that we are supporting the pastor, the staff, and maintaining **two** facilities for the programming we feel called to provide. Kudos to us all for this vision, commitment, and generosity. The future is looking good!

Some exciting plans for this year are a summer community picnic, expansion of our Family Camp, and a second annual Women's Retreat. Our Endowment Fund has awarded grants to all three of these programs as part of the over \$10,000 dollars it was able to award this year.

On the financial front, we are better off than we were a year ago. Thanks to the congregation's generous response to our needs, we ended 2023 in the black. We ended January 2024 with an even larger fund balance. Unfortunately, the past two months we have spent more than we've taken in, ending the first quarter in a slight deficit.

While we seem to be doing well at managing ongoing costs and programs, we would like to build a cash reserve of several thousand dollars, up to one month's expenses, so we face money crises and the need for pleas to our membership less often. This is difficult when we can't consistently manage our current budget expenses, but we remain optimistic that we can achieve this goal this year.

The larger challenge is our long-term maintenance needs.

There are several items on this list that our trustees' team have cited as major needs to be addressed within the next 5 to 6 years. Most of the projects and expense is roof maintenance, including replacement of some sections. The most pressing need is a large section of roof on the original structure at The Praise Center at an estimated cost of \$25,000.

Maintaining our buildings is critical to offering the ministries that we do. The total estimated cost for all these items is roughly \$300,000, an imposing figure. To put this amount in perspective, it is the annual budget that we fund every year.

Rather than addressing the total amount as a goal, we are stating it as needing \$50,000 a year for the next 6 years, above and beyond our general operating budget. To begin, we are reinstituting our long-term maintenance fund. We would ask that you prayerfully consider what you feel moved to and are able to donate to this fund beyond your planned or usual general fund giving.

In addition to this, we have been discussing Ideas for fund raising and would welcome input from all of you.

For more information, questions, or suggestions please contact the church office or any member of the Leadership Team. If that individual does not have the answer, they can at least guide you to a member who should.

ENDOWMENT UPDATE



WLUMC ENDOWMENT MONTHLY REPORT

MARCH 2024

Beginning Balance (3/1/2024)	\$190,164.05
Dividend Income	292.02
Disbursements (Grants)	- 4,000.00
Change in Market Value	3,267.55
Ending Value	<u>\$189,729.62</u>

As we continue through our distribution season of this year's grants, it should be recognized that the fund continues to flourish. \$4,000 was withdrawn from the fund to cover those grants that requested payment. At the same time the fund earned \$298.02 in dividend earnings and \$3,267.55 due to the market value of our stock changing. Thus, at the end of March, the fund shows a closing balance value of \$189,729.62. This is only slightly down from our beginning value on March 1st.

Thank you to all who have shown such great faith with this most wonderful vehicle. As it continues to grow, it means more and more capital for grants in the coming years. With God's guidance and your continuing prayers, I'm sure our fund's future is bright.
