From the Pastor's Desk . . .

Summer is soooooo over...there I have said it! Fall is in full swing with leaves falling, football games being played, and school life back even if in a new pattern. The Christian calendar is about to end on November 26th and a new year begins the 1st Sunday in Advent on December 3rd.

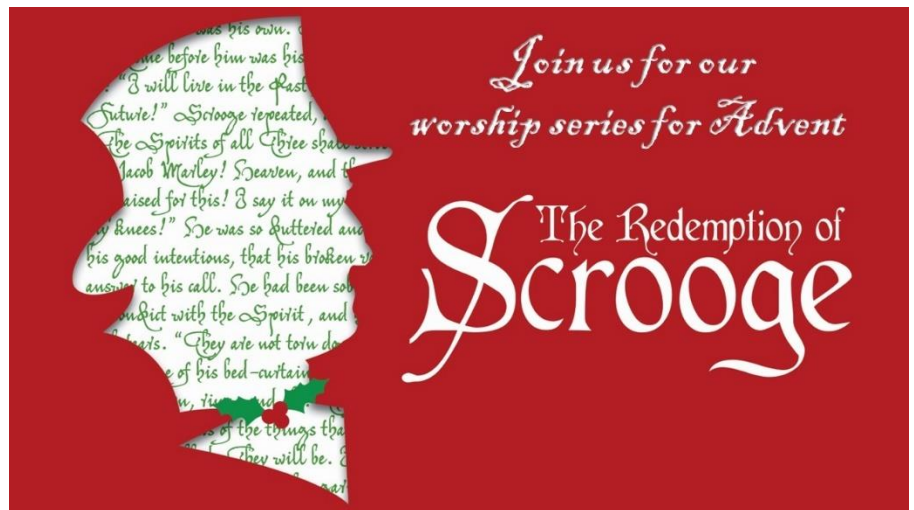
November choir practice dates –

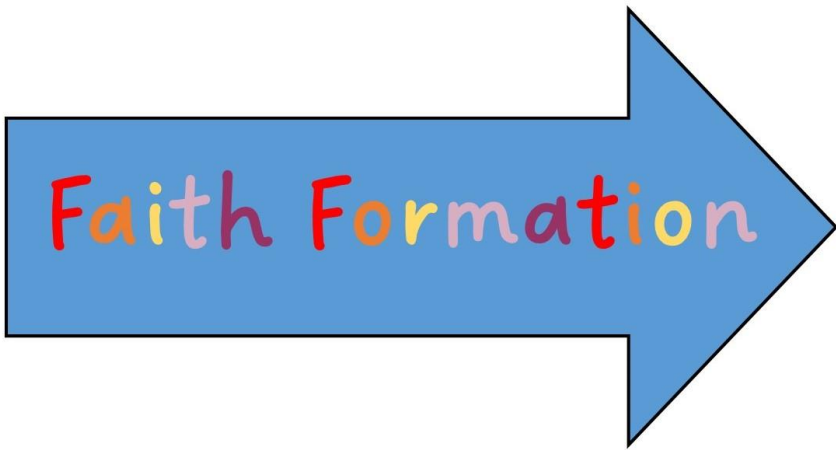

CANOPY PROJECT

The canopy structure and roofing have been completed thanks to the help of our congregation's talented workers. The outer door frame has been ordered. When it is in place, we will remove the inner supports and finish the electrical and ceiling items.

At present we have paid Winberg Construction approximately \$50,000 for material and labor. We are anticipating another \$30,000 yet due. We are progressing as we have a generous grant of \$5,000 coming into our account.

Hopefully a ribbon cutting for the project will occur very soon!

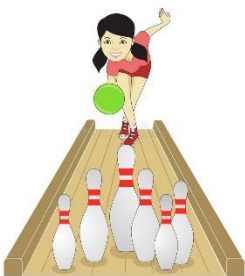

MEMORIAL BRICKS with BRICKMARKERS

Many of you will no doubt remember this worthwhile project. It provides us with a simple, but effective way to erect memorials to our loved ones, whilst giving much needed funds to our church.

Here's how it works!

1) Place an order for your brick(s)

- a. Supply the information to be engraved on it (by paper form or online). We will make this really easy.
- b. Pay \$60.00 for a standard 4"x 8" brick, which allows up to 3 lines of print of up to 20 characters each (engraved pictures/logos are available, too, but you have to give up some print space).
- c. Or, pay \$90.00 for an 8"x 8" brick, which allows up to 6 lines of print of up to 20 characters each.
- d. Wait until the day you see your new brick on the wall or walkway!

2) At both the Montague Campus and Whitehall Campus there will be:

- a. An area for "Memorial" bricks for loved ones who have died, whether recently or a long time ago.

Typically, this means the brick will contain a name or names and years of birth and death. There will even be a separate section to memorialize pets.

- b. An area for "celebratory" bricks, such as your family name or celebrations of weddings, births, graduations, silver and gold anniversaries, or anything else you wish to commemorate.

For the most part, it is just that simple!

September 2023 Finance Report

The below table presents a condensed view of the WLUMC finances for September 2023. The General Fund income was lower than that needed to meet expenses, though a bit better than the August number. Fortunately, the General Fund expenses for September were also lower than the monthly average but still greater than the income. The net result is that the General Fund check book balance at the end of September was nearly \$900 lower than at the end of August. As of this writing on October 20, the General Fund balance is essentially zero. This means that the Treasurer will need to borrow from designated fund accounts to pay the bills, until the General Fund check book balance is increased by Sunday collections. The above is especially concerning, as November is one of the two months of the year that has three pay periods versus the typical 2.
