### *From the Pastor's Desk*

Fall is in full swing with leaves falling, football games being played, and school life back to its familiar pattern. But the seasons continue to change, and Winter is just around the corner! The Christian calendar is about to end on November 24th and a new year begins the 1st Sunday in Advent on December 1st.

Now is as good a time as any to reflect on the state of our church and our own personal discipleship. All Saints Sunday gives us pause to remember the faithful legacy we have inherited here at White Lake United Methodist Church (WLUMC). Our Charge Conference on Sunday, October 20th was a time to celebrate the Holy Spirit led mission work of our church and the commitments we made earlier that day as we continued to celebrate our stewardship and prepared for Commitment Sunday. The questions that I ask you and myself are "What is the status of my discipleship? 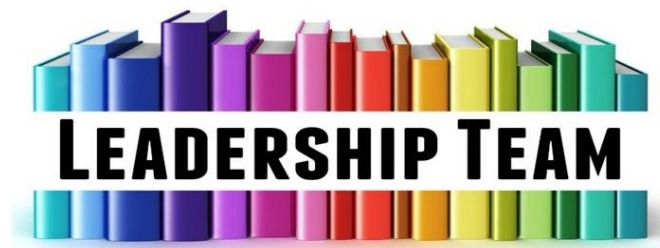

## Closure of The Praise Center

Your church leaders would like to briefly summarize the recent events concerning The Praise Center to keep you all informed.

After many months of struggling with the issue, your church leaders came to the conclusion that it was no longer economically feasible to maintain two separate facilities. Many factors were considered as we contemplated the best path forward to continue the important ministry of White Lake United Methodist Church. Your Leadership Team decided that closing and selling the Whitehall building was the most viable option and proposed this recommendation be submitted for the congregational members' consideration.

After working with some of our district staff to verify the correct process and have the property assessed, the proposal was presented for a members' vote at the conclusion of regular business at our Annual Church Conference on Sunday, October 20<sup>th</sup>. The vote was conducted by a written ballot with the options to vote yes, no, or abstain. This motion - "The Leadership Team of White Lake United Methodist Church moves to sell The Praise Center at 117 S. Division Street, Whitehall, Michigan 49461, for not less than \$350,00. The property to be listed for sale at \$450,00. Proceeds from the sale will be used for the Building Fund of White Lake United Methodist Church. Further, Richard Baerman, Trustee Chair and Glen Naghtin, Leadership Team Chair are designated as signatories." - passed with 55 yes votes, 4 no votes, and no abstentions.

We are now in the process of listing the property through NAI Wisinski of West Michigan, the commercial realty firm that did the original appraisal and evaluation. They toured the building again on Monday, October 28<sup>th</sup>, to prepare for the listing.

Prior to the church membership vote, the Leadership Team decided it best to move the Praise Service and Sunday School to the Montague campus on November 3<sup>rd</sup>. The Transition Team, with the help of several others in the church, has planned where the different programs, classes and meetings will take place and are currently busy with the moving of items from Whitehall to Montague. At this time, The Gathering and the Free Store are remaining at the Praise Center in Whitehall while we continue with preparations for their transition to the Montague building. We plan to move these to Montague before winter so that we can winterize and close the Whitehall building to save on utilities, and so we are well prepared for the sale of that building when it occurs.

Change is always hard to accept, but inevitable. We have all experienced a lot of change over the last ten years; and we have experienced it together as one church community for the past seven. Let us be empathetic and supportive of one another through this new transition as we all work through the various emotions we will experience during the coming months. It will take all of us cooperatively applying the gifts God has provided each of us to continue the great ministry we are providing to our community.

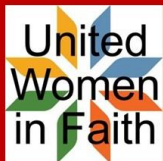

## Mental Health Focus – Suicide Prevention Program – November 23, 2024

Tis the season . . . ? For some the upcoming holiday season is full of fond memories and festivities: however, for others these autumn into winter months remind us of past injustices and another lonely and unhappy, perhaps even desperate, time to endure.

As followers of Christ, we know one of the certainties in our lives is looking after each other. We are called to be compassionate neighbors and helpers. To aid us in this mission, the WLUMC Health & Wellness Team has invited professionals and experienced laypeople to present a suicide prevention program on **November 23, 2024, at 12:30 p.m.** The program will follow a pizza lunch at **The Gathering in the WLUMC Praise Center** fellowship hall.

Healthwest counselor Michael Pyne will introduce the suicide prevention programs available in Muskegon County and a preview of the free online program QPR. “QPR stands for Question, Persuade, Refer and will give you some of the skills needed to help save the life of someone who is thinking about suicide. . . This evidence-based training helps to reduce the apprehension that you may feel when confronted with a person who wants to take their own life.”

Members of both Whitehall and Montague High School’s Hope Squads will share how they outreach with their peers. Sandi Teichmer, our local Held in Hope Support Group coordinator will describe her personal outreach efforts and those of the national support network.

Healthwest counselor Alecia Hughes who works with families in our local school districts will describe her role in the White Lake area.

Hopefully, this program will answer your questions and inspire you. We are all in this together and we can help each other! You are not alone.

This month marks the first time the fund has reached the two hundred grand mark in value, doubling our initial investment. This all the while we were issuing grants to the tune of \$161,264.00 to help those in need.

I thank all those who have served on its committee/team since its inception and had to make those tough decisions about how much to grant each year and where the grants would be given. I wonder what the future holds in store for this amazing gift. I can only imagine. I know it will rely on our steadfast care. Praise Center:

- Transitioning out of the building. We will begin moving on Oct 28, help is always accepted.
- We will be shutting down the sanctuary and setting heat to a minimum.
- Removing sound and video systems is our priority. Stay tuned.
- Moving Sunday School and Youth Room will also take place 10/28 if possible.

Montague Campus:

- Work is done regarding the lightning strike on our interior repairs. The Internet seems good, and the sound and video systems are performing as intended.
- New Cross is atop the old bell tower. We are finished except for lightning aversion work being added to the Cross for protection.
- Sprinklers are shut down. Working on blowing out the system for the winter.
- Heating systems are working. Nursery heat is being fixed. Zone Valve will be replaced.
- Claire is closing up the east gardens. What an incredible year. Thanks Claire.
- Lots of trimming done. The men's group worked on helping the gardening teams to trim bushes and trees. Great work, thanks
- Wow, working on transitioning ministries from the Praise Center to the Montague Campus. Mon, 10/28 is a big moving day. First there will be sound and video systems moved and installed at Montague. Our, much older, system will be sold after the newer system(s) and installed and working. Tech Team is on this one. Any help is appreciated.
- The TV is broken and removed from the Fellowship Hall. New TV, from the Praise Center, will replace it. No need to buy a new one.

Thanks for all the effort from everyone helping to maintain and improve our facilities. What an incredible group.  
Parsonage:

- Sprinkler system is not being run, for now. We will see how we are doing next year prior to turning it on. Some repairs are needed before turning this system on. Stay tuned.
- The pesky split rail fence at the front entrance will need some work as well. Glen Naghtin provided some much-needed fence sections, and we will get them placed to fix the problem.
- Thanks to Larry Lindquist for mowing the parsonage lawn. Great Job. It will need another mowing and leaf removal as well this fall. Stay tuned for the help needed to this.

What a great combination of facilities and people to improve the lives of so many through our ministries and outreach to our communities.

### Finance Report

The August 2024 Finance Report below shows that collections continued to lag behind budget. Fortunately, expenses were

also low due to lower than historic maintenance costs. Also, August Ministry Shares (apportionments) were not paid, waiting for directions from the Leadership Team to authorize payment given the precariously low General Fund balance. That authorization has been received.

Because September was a five Sunday month, collections were up versus August, allowing us to catch up on a month of Conference apportionments. Again, expenses were lower than historic costs, leaving the check-book balance to stay healthy. With the authorization received from the Leadership Team, out of 9 months we will have paid 4 months of the Conference Apportionments and 5 months the District Apportionments.

I would like to remind you that the treasurer has opened a designated account to collect contributions for long-term maintenance, such as a needed roof replacement for the Montague campus.
